Course Purpose and Objectives	This course completes the breakthrough (beginner's level, A1+ CEFR) in Modern Greek. Basic users of Modern Greek are further introduced to the fundamentals of the language through practicing all four language skills (reading, writing, listening and speaking) in the context of everyday situations.				
Learning Outcomes	<p><b>Upon successful completion of this course, students should be able to:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Use, both in speaking and writing, familiar everyday expressions and very basic phrases aimed at the satisfaction of needs of a concrete type. (e.g write basic notes and hold simple basic discussions on shopping, entertainment, professional interests)</li> <li>• Fill in simple forms needed for travelling, identification documents.</li> <li>• Introduce him/herself and others and ask and answer simple questions about personal details (e.g. share information on residence, age, profession, nationality, hobbies).</li> <li>• Interact in a simple way on simple topics (e.g. describe people or objects, give directions to a place)</li> </ul>

Course Content	Grammatical phenomena and language functions are introduced and reinforced through reading, listening, speaking and writing.
