Course Purpose and Objectives	<p>This course further develops student's command of Greek so that they complete way stage (elementary) A2+ level (CEFR). Through practicing all four language skills (reading, writing, speaking and listening), students are enabled to understand sentences and frequently-used expressions involving everyday topics (e.g. exchanging personal and family information, shopping, local geography, employment). They are also further introduced to communicating routine tasks, both orally and in writing, and to exchanging information on familiar and everyday matters.</p>
